



# Digital CB Club

English edition

## 1 - What is the Digital CB Club?

It is simply a group of radio amateurs operators in the Citizen Band, we like digital modes, and make contact with them.

## 2 - Why born the Digital CB Club?

For two reasons:

The first is that the vast majority of radio clubs in the world, do not allow digital communications, or at least, use her call in this way.

Second, confirmation of contacts, because in the XXI century we cannot ignore the Internet and all the benefits it brings.

## 3 – The Digital CB Club base

When we make contact, we will have to confirm this, but in the XXI century, we cannot ignore that the internet is a confirmatory method only safe but also applying our system of exchange of contacts, never seen before in the CB, we can access multiple awards, exclusive to DCBC members.

## 4 – How Works the QSOs confirmation system?

Crossing contact a "blind" mode.

So far, although there may be the possibility of sending electronic QSL cards, there remains the problem that we can confirm some contact unrealized. This is achieved if we do not know if our interlocutor has also sent the contact.

Let us explain in a more detailed way. I am the amateur "A", and performed a contact with "B" and "C". I upload the ADIF file to my club server, and are stored there waiting for that "B" and "C" confirm them. Now "B", upload his contact me with "A". The system detects that "A" had already added this contact, and therefore, "A" and "B" it will have confirmed. But if "C" does not, I cannot confirm this, even sending paper or electronic QSL card.

## 5 - What modes are supported in the Digital CB Club?

For all than are digital. From famous as the PSK or RTTY, to Olivia or Hell, even the newest ROS and JT65. In addition, two "special", the CW is also a digital mode, and therefore admitted, and DV, that although this is a mode of phony, also remains a digital mode.

## **6 - What requirements must I meet to join in the DCBC?**

Just want to. No fees, term commitments, nor commitment to purchase material.

Of course, a necessary Internet, our contacts are confirmed by this platform.

## **7 – A basic rules**

Like any radio club, we follow some basic rules to belong to it. They are the following:

- a) To confirm a contact made by the club, you should always use the code of the Member. It is distinguishable from other radio clubs that use the initials "DC" Digital Club.
- b) To be eligible for the awards, the contacts must to be confirmed by the club's own system.
- c) However, sending QSL cards, both electronic and paper is allowed, but will not serve as confirmation of contact.
- d) The member callsign is automatically assigned at the time of registration in the DCBC server using the classic lines that exist for the CB, being the ddDCnnn format, where "dd" is the division of the member, "DC" the DCBC acronyms, and "nnn" is a serial number to identify individually in the club.
- e) The callsign is not subject to working with digital modes, but also can be used in phone, but are not valid contacts performed for confirmation or for awards.
- f) It is possible to get a "vanity callsign" where a smaller number of 100 will be offered, for example, ddDC033, which is obtained after a donation to the club because we maintain servers and no fee is charged some to belong to DCBC.
- g) For the rest, as always, we have to be polite, well spoken and avoid discussions of political, religious or likely to offend in any way the sensitivity of our interlocutor or listeners.

## **8 –Permanent Awards**

We are a new club, and thus also our awards. You can get free diplomas that are running, such as the CAC, acronyms for "Confirmed All Continents", but also, if the postage and printing them covered, we will send them in paper.

## **9 – Contest**

One of the purposes of DCBC is to promote contests in various digital modes, and this, we will develop in a way that can be fun, and as far as possible periodically.

## **10 – Activations**

We shall not be less than the rest, and therefore we encourage our members to develop activities: village festivals, historical fact ... the only thing we ask is two things, first, to be developed in digital modes, and second, we would you say before, and perhaps, for some reason this cannot be done by that contradicts the basic rules of the club.

## **11 – Collaborations**

We are open in unimaginable ways to collaborate in activities with other radioclubs, and we think it's the end of amateur radio, collaborate.
